WHY BE A SITE INVESTIGATOR?

Site Investigators (SIs) are the core of TORRO's research and are what makes our whirlwind database arguably the most credible of its kind anywhere in the world with >90 % of all known tornadoes investigated.

Your evidence will help TORRO come to a conclusion on what happened be it straight line wind, downburst or tornado. You will be advised on these specifications if necessary.



WHAT DOES IT ENTAIL?

Further information will be sent to you on registration as an official TORRO Site Investigator but typical criteria for conducting a site investigation are:

- 1) To establish the event that caused the damage - you will get help with this
- 2) Take photographs of all damage found that pertains to the event
- 3) All you need is a camera, notebook, pencil and a map. You are there to assess the damage and debris 'placement', and try and gather witness statements.

Full guidance and support will be given to you before and during your investigation by experienced investigators and the SI Coordinator.
